Assessment system

The objective of the assessment of the subject is to achieve that students take on objectives and competences commented in this guide. The student will be able to choose between two types of assessments:

Option 1: Ongoing assessment

- Participation in the activities proposed in the classroom with tutor monitoring. A detailed development of these activities as well as the delivery date of these exercises will be commented in the classroom.
- Realization, in groups, of a scientific article based on the research performed in the subject 'Methods' of the second course of the degree. *Delivery date: May 5 and 7*
- *Final examination*: a final examination will be carried out which confirms that the student has reached the expected learning results from the subjects.

Option 2: Final assessment

Students opting for this type of assessment will take a final examination regarding the whole subject programme with a value of 100% of the final grade.

Usual monitoring of the virtual classroom is advisable for its preparation.
